Below are the instructions for the warm-up activity – Play “Disciple Search.”

Write the numbers 1 through 12 on large index cards along with the names of the disciples. Each card represents one disciple. Toss the cards up in the air and let them fall to the floor. Ask students to gather the disciples but they must choose them in order from 1 to 12.

1=Simon (Peter), 2=Andrew, 3=James (son of Zebedee), 4=John, 5=Phillip, 6=Bartholomew, 7=Thomas, 8=Matthew, 9=James (son of Alphaeus), 10=Thaddeus, 11=Simon (the Zealot), 12=Judas Iscariot

Scripture Summary




Key Verse Exercise

Read the verse to remember aloud.

Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority to cure every disease and every sickness. (Matthew 10:1)

Give each student the set of key verse stickers in Appendix A. Then tell students to use the key verse stickers to complete the key verse sudoku puzzle. Every row and column must contain each part of the verse. Do not repeat the same phrase twice in any row or column. When the puzzle is complete show how every row is filled with different shapes and every column is filled with different shapes so students can learn the strategy of sudoku.


Did the disciples use money for food to eat or places to sleep? No. They had to rely on the hospitality of others.

Read Matthew 10:5-14 in the NIV bible to highlight the instructions Jesus gave the disciples when he sent them out. Ask students to help the Faithful Five find the things Jesus told the disciples not to bring on their journeys so they could travel light.

“Do not get any gold or silver or copper to take with you in your belts – no bag for the journey or extra shirt or sandals or a staff, for the worker is worth his keep.”



Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a Helping Story Wheel.

Materials needed: Copies of the Story Wheel Template in Appendix B (one cover and wheel per student), metal brads, scissors, pencils, markers or crayons

Instructions: Distribute a blank story template and brad to each student. Cut out the story wheel patterns. Be sure to also cut along the dotted lines on the story wheel cover to leave an open triangular reading space. Allow students to depict a time they helped others with pictures or words on the story wheel. Encourage students to be creative as they color the story wheel cover. Use the brad to fasten the center of the story wheel cover to the center of the story wheel. Make sure the fastener is loose enough to turn the story wheel.

Close the lesson with prayer.

Adventures of the Faithful Five - Episode 7: Show and Tell

Like other students that presented before him, Israel had to "tell" a story about a **role model** who demonstrates kindness. While he was telling the story, he was to "show" the role model. The other students used a photo of their role models. Israel had something else in mind.

"Alright, Israel. Show us your role model," said Miss Wright. Israel replied, "My role model is here in person. It's Jay."

"What!" exclaimed Jay. Miss Wright asked Jay to stand next to Israel in the front of the class. Now he was feeling nervous. But he calmed down when his classmates clapped for him as he walked to the front. Then Israel asked Jay a few questions to show why he chose him as a role model for kindness.

Israel- When we talk about kindness, we are talking about being nice to someone. Jay what should we say when someone hands you something?

Jay- Thank you.


Complete the Superhero Challenge if time permits.

Tell students the Faithful Five want to write a prayer of thanksgiving. Help them by writing a prayer to thank Jesus for his sacrifice. Students can write the prayer as a large group, in small groups, or individually.

Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a Billboard Hat.

Materials needed: Copies of the Kindness Message in Appendix C (one message per student), paper plates (in various colors), scissors, markers or crayons, glue

Instructions: Distribute a kindness message and paper plate to each student. Allow students to color the kindness message. Fold the paper plate in half. Cut away the rim. Draw a rectangle along the fold as shown in the illustration. Cut the short sides of the rectangle. Open the plate to cut the right side of the square. Make a fold along the left side of the square. The square should stand up like a sign or billboard. Glue the kindness message to the front of the square. Allow the glue to dry before wearing the hat.



Close the lesson with prayer.

Share Good News with Others

Below are the instructions for the warm-up activity – Play “Share the Good News.”

This game is played like “Operator.” Whisper “Jesus is alive” in the ear of one student. Ask each student to share the message by whispering it in the ear of the classmate next to them. The last student to receive the message is to share it aloud with the class. Emphasize how Christians are to share the good news with others by telling them about Jesus.

Scripture Summary

Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to visit Jesus’ tomb. Suddenly the earth shook as an angel came from heaven and rolled back the stone in front of the tomb. The security guards were so scared they could not move. The angel told the women that Jesus was risen from the dead just as he said he would be. The angel also told the women to tell the disciples that Jesus is alive and will meet them when they arrive in Galilee.

Adventures of the Faithful Five - Episode 8: The Resurrection

Today is Resurrection Sunday! The Faithful Five are performing in the church school play to tell the Resurrection story.

Israel - As you know they **crucified** Jesus. They hung him on a cross and tortured him. Jesus finally died on the cross. When He died an earthquake came and shook up everything. People were afraid! When evening came, a man named Joseph asked for the body of Jesus. The Roman Governor, Pilate, gave it to him. Joseph took the body of Jesus and wrapped him in clean linen cloth and put the body in a tomb.

Taj - Joseph rolled a big stone in front of the entrance and went away. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were sitting across from the tomb. The next day, Pilate put a guard in front of the tomb to make sure no one could go in or out.

Aaliyah - He also put a seal on the stone. After the Sabbath Day, which was the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look in the tomb.

Tori - There was a terrible earthquake when an angel of the Lord had come down from heaven. The angel went to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. The guards were so afraid they could not move. The angel said to the women,

Akeem – “Don't be afraid. Jesus is not here. He has risen! See where He laid. He has risen! Go tell the disciples”.

Tori - The women were filled with joy and ran to tell the disciples Jesus was on his way to Galilee and they would see him there.

Israel - You see, Jesus died and rose from the dead. This is what the **Resurrection** is. It means to live again! Share the Good News.

Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a cross necklace.

Materials needed: He Lives Necklace Craft Kit (order from <https://www.orientaltrading.com/he-lives-necklace-craft-kit-a2-13779169.fltr>)

Instructions: Distribute the craft supplies to each student as specified in the craft kit instructions. Then assemble the necklace in accordance with the craft kit instructions. (Optional: Play the YouTube video "1-2-3 Jesus Is Alive" - <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Mlf9jv4pVTM> - while students work on their necklaces.) Encourage students to wear their necklaces the entire day.

Close the lesson with prayer.

Going on a Mission

Get Excited!

Below are the instructions for the warm-up activity – Have a discussion on God’s presence.

Ask students to share how they know God is with them. If students have trouble expressing themselves, ask them to think about the times when they feel brave or very happy or like they are not alone even when no one else is in the room. Limit the discussion to five minutes.

Scripture Summary

When the disciples saw Jesus in Galilee after he rose from the dead, some of them worshiped him, but some did not believe it was really him. Jesus still commanded all of them to teach people in all nations how to be a disciple. They were also to baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Key Verse Exercise

Read the verse to remember aloud.

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations. And remember, I am with you always.” (Matthew 28:19-20)

Tell students to color the places where they see phrases in the verse to remember. See if anyone recognizes these places on the map. (Answer: They are the seven continents – North America, South America, Asia, Europe, Africa, Australia, Antarctica)

Adventures of the Faithful Five - Episode 9: Israel Learns a Lesson

Israel was feeling nervous again about another show-and-tell he had to do. This time it was in church school. Sometimes when Israel felt nervous, he also felt the **urgency** to use the bathroom. This was one of those times. “Israel it’s time to go. Where are you” asked Israel’s mother. “Mom I’m in the bathroom! I’ll be right down,” Israel replied. “Okay hurry up so we can get to church. I know you may feel a little nervous, but you are prepared to do your show-and-tell. There’s no need to worry,” his mother **assured** him.

Israel saw Akeem as his mother was pulling into the church parking lot. “Akeem wait for me!” he yelled out the window. When Israel caught up to Akeem he asked him, “Will you be my role model during show-and-tell?” Akeem was surprised by Israel’s request so he replied, “Why me?” Israel said, “I am talking about obedience and I know no one knows God’s commandments like you do.” Akeem agreed to be Israel’s role model for the show-and-tell.

Mrs. Davis, the church school teacher, greeted the class and asked Israel to start his presentation. Israel and Akeem went to the front of the class. Israel used the same **strategy** he used in school by asking Akeem a few questions to show why he chose him as a role model for obedience.

Israel - Akeem how can we obey God?

Akeem- We can obey God by following the Ten Commandments.

Israel - Correct! But we can’t follow them unless we know them. Can you name five of the commandments?

Akeem - Yes, I can! Do not steal. Do not lie. Do not use the Lord's name in vain. Honor your parents. And most importantly, know that God is our one and only God.

Israel - Correct! I messed up with one of the commandments this morning. I did not obey my mom. She asked me to take out the trash and I didn't. I was watching my favorite television show and forgot to do it. I took the trash out immediately when she asked me the second time, but our parents should only have to ask us one time to do anything and we should do what we are asked at that moment, not when we feel like it. Thank you.

Mrs. Davis thanked Israel and Akeem for the presentation. Before dismissing the class she said, "Remember boys and girls obeying your parents gives you practice for obeying God. Also remember God is always present to help you do the things he wants you to do."



Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a passport.

Materials needed: Copies of the Passport Template in Appendix D (one per student), blue card stock paper, blank white paper, markers or crayons, scissors, glue sticks, stapler

Instructions: Before class, fold the blue card stock horizontally and cut along the fold. Fold each piece of cut cardstock in half. One piece of card stock will create two passports. Cut as many pieces of cardstock needed to create one passport per student.

During class give each student a copy of the Passport Template and a blank sheet of white paper. Cut all pieces in the template along the dotted lines. Fold the blank sheet of paper horizontally and cut along the fold. Fold each piece of cut paper in half. Place the folded white pages inside the blue cardstock and staple along the center fold to create the passport book.













Lay the passport book horizontally. Glue the star to the front of the passport book. Next glue the personal information cutout to the first page. Student should fill in the blanks and draw a picture of themselves. Then glue the passport stamps on each of the remaining pages inside the passport book. Encourage students to write different places the disciples went in the passport stamps. They can also write the places they can go to let others know about Jesus.

Close the lesson with prayer.
