Scripture Summary

Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples during the same time the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread were celebrated. The Passover is the observance of God freeing the Israelites from slavery. The Feast of Unleavened Bread was a seven-day celebration where the Israelites ate bread without yeast to represent their departure from Egypt. At the Last Supper meal, Jesus established a new promise from God that the Holy Spirit would live inside of us.

Key Verse Exercise

Read the verse to remember aloud.

Adventures of the Faithful Five – Episode 1: A Seder Invitation

Israel was so excited! A friend from school who attends a Jewish **synagogue** invited him over to his home to celebrate Passover with his family. Israel learned in church school that God told the Jewish people to always celebrate the Passover meal beginning with the night they were set free from slavery in Egypt. He also remembered learning that the Passover meal was also the Last Supper Jesus ate with his disciples the night before the crucifixion.

“I am so glad your parents are going to let you come over and share a seder meal with my family,” said his friend.

“What is a seder meal?” asked Israel.

“In Jewish tradition,” said Israel’s friend, “the seder meal contains a plate of six symbolic foods each having a special meaning of retelling the story of the **Exodus** from Egypt. The seventh item during the meal is a stack of unleavened bread called matzah, that is placed on its own plate. Four cups of the fruit of the vine (or wine) relate to different parts of the seder representing the four types of **deliverance** promised by God. We also serve one another juice.”

“Wow!” said Israel! “What an interesting way to celebrate Passover.”

As everyone gathered to sit in their seats at the seder table, Israel began to think about God’s covenant with us. Because of God’s love for us, we are all invited to sit at God’s table and experience forgiveness of our sins. Israel closed his eyes and said a short prayer of thanks to God for keeping his promise, that he is our God and we are his people.


Complete the Superhero Challenge if time permits.

Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a Last Supper cup.

Materials: Copies of Appendix A (one per student), cardstock paper, scissors, markers or crayons, tape

Instructions: Print copies of the Last Supper Cup pattern in Appendix A on cardstock paper. Color the cup and then cut out the cup and rectangular strips. Tell students triangles are the strongest shapes. Tape the two strips together to make one long strip. Fold the long strip into a triangle. Use tape to fasten loose ends. Then tape the triangle to the back of the cup to make a stand.

Pilate asked them if they wanted to release Jesus, but the people said “No!” Pilate knew Jesus was innocent, but he released him to be crucified anyway.



Adventures of the Faithful Five – Episode 2: Giving It Up

I'm doing okay. I have a busy schedule this week. Tori has dance practice at the church. Her brother has a basketball game. I'm volunteering at the church outreach on Saturday afternoon and I have choir practice afterwards, so I won't be able to go. I hope you and the girls have a nice trip"

Tori had a **concerned** look on her face as she asked her mom, "What trip?" Her mother answered, "My friends are going on a day trip and wanted to know if I wanted to go, but I am too busy this week."

Tori was still concerned so she asked her mother, "Mom, why do you do all these things for us and other people? It seems like you never have time for yourself. Why do you make **sacrifices**?" Her mother walked over to her and said, "Well, it isn't always easy to make sacrifices. Sometimes I must choose between something that is just for me and things I need to do for my family or things to help those in need. I am not the only one who makes sacrifices Tori. You make sacrifices when you come home and choose to do homework or read your devotion instead of watching TV."

"You're right mom. I never thought of that," Tori said.

“There is someone else who made an even bigger sacrifice for all of us. Remember, Jesus made the **ultimate** sacrifice so that the world might be saved. It wasn’t easy for him to die on the cross, but he was committed to serving God and loving us so that we could have a relationship with God again. It isn’t easy to make sacrifices, but it is worth it. Jesus teaches us that we too must make sacrifices for God if we choose to follow God’s Word,” said Tori’s mom. Before Tori went back to doing her homework, she paused and thanked God for Jesus’ sacrifice and prayed that God would help her to make the right sacrifices for him.

Tell students these bible verses are about promises, sacrifice and commitment. Encourage students to use the flashcards as a study tool to learn the bible verses by the end of the month. (Optional: Conduct a “bible bee” - similar to a spelling bee - at the end of the month.)

Below are the instructions for the warm-up activity – Make a human knot.

Gather students into a circle. Each child should stretch out one hand to grab the hand of a child across from him or her and then use the other hand to join to someone else in the circle. Students should then try to untangle the circle without releasing hands. Limit the activity time to five minutes. Emphasize how we are all tied together through Christ.

Scripture Summary

The apostle Paul writes a letter to the Church of Colossae and Laodicea while he is in prison. Paul also shares how baptism shows that we buried our old life to be resurrected in our new life with Christ and encourages the believers there to stay united in love. The more they learned about Christ together as a faith community, the more they would be able to stand together against false teachers.


Complete the Superhero Challenge if time permits.

Instructions: Before class cut the construction paper into 2x11 inch strips. During class give each student a construction paper strip. Ask students to use a marker or crayon to creatively write their name on the strip. Use the stapler or tape to make a chain. Hang the chain in the classroom to remind students they are united in Christ.

Some rewards for Beatitudes are received during the time we live on earth and some rewards will be received eternally in heaven.

Adventures of the Faithful Five – Episode 5: A Call to Rescue

The Faithful Five have always been a team of adventure, but today’s adventure was a little less about play and more about responding. Akeem’s mom signed the Faithful Five up as junior **first responders** at the local county fair for the weekend. The fair was allowing children to volunteer as first responders to teach them about caring for others. As the team was looking at the fair brochure and discussing the attractions, they heard a loud cry. A young boy exiting the Ferris wheel ride missed the first step down and landed on his face. He scraped his nose and his knee and they both were bleeding.

Akeem grabbed the first aid kit and then the Faithful Five ran to the Ferris wheel. Junior first responders had been taught how to take care of small cuts and bruises so the Faithful Five knew what to do. They felt bad for the young boy and not only wanted to fix his wounds but also comfort him. Akeem introduced the Faithful Five. “Hi, I’m Akeem. These are my friends Taj, Aaliyah, Tori and Israel. People call us the Faithful Five.” The boy was still crying and looked afraid. The Faithful Five wanted to **assure** him everything would be okay, so they shared stories about times they were scared and afraid; times they bruised their arms and cut their knees; and times when they were filled with joy. After a while the young boy stopped **sobbing** and started to smile.

Shortly after a police officer arrived to check on things. The boy told him that he was okay and how the Faithful Five came to bandage his wounds and comfort him. The officer smiled and was grateful! He reached in his pocket and congratulated the Faithful Five for helping the little boy. He gave each of them a first responder sticker and thanked them for their hearts of **compassion**.


You will need to make 12 signs on poster boards for this activity: 6 signs will have the first half of a beatitude and 6 signs will have the last half of a beatitude. (See the table below for the wording.) Pick 12 students to hold each sign. Line the students up in front of the class, but make sure they are in a scrambled order.

First Half	Last Half
Blessed are the poor in spirit	theirs is the kingdom of heaven
Blessed are those who mourn	they shall be comforted
Blessed are the meek	they shall inherit the earth
Blessed are the merciful	they shall obtain mercy
Blessed are the pure in heart	they shall see God
Blessed are the peacemakers	they shall be called children of God

Tell students blessed means more than happiness. Blessed means to enjoy eternal rewards. (Repeat the key verse: Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.) Help the Faithful Five remember the meaning of blessed by playing the “Right Attitude” game. Give the class five minutes to tell the students in line where to go so the first half of a beatitude is matched with its second half. Set a stopwatch for five minutes to time the challenge. Students can use the bible (digital or printed) as a reference. The beatitudes are in Matthew 5:1-12.

Below are the instructions for the Time to Create activity – Make a Bee-Attitude.

Materials: Copies of Appendix D, yellow construction paper, black pipe cleaners, scissors, markers or crayons, tape or glue





Instructions: Print copies of Bee-Attitude wings in Appendix D (one per student). Give each student a set of wings, a half sheet of yellow construction paper and a black pipe cleaner. Color thick lines across the yellow construction paper like a bumble bee. Then make a short tube out of yellow construction paper and glue or the tube closed. Cut a pipe cleaner in half and round the ends in a small tight circle to create antennae. Use tape to attach the antennae to the tube. Cut out the Bee-Attitude wings and use tape or glue to attach the wings to the tube.

Close the lesson with prayer.

Lord, help us to have an attitude of love like Jesus. Remind us that we should care more about others than ourselves and that we can receive your blessings when we live the Beatitudes in our daily lives. In Jesus name, Amen.


